I wanted to share a little episode with you in my message for this month's Mangan.

At this year's O-Bon, I misplaced my handheld bell called the *shukei* and realized it was missing after everything had been cleaned up and stored away. I tried to remember where I last put it, but could not recollect where I had left it. I began to think of the many possible things that could have happened. I thought maybe it was mistakenly put in one of the boxes that had been stored in the storage rooms and went looking for it there, but was unable to find it. I had gone to do a service at Roselani Place (an elderly home in Kahului) a few days after the O-Bon and thought I had forgotten it there so I went to look for it, but again I was unable to find it. Then I began to think that someone must have stolen it. In the end, I was resigned that I may have lost it forever, but hopeful that it may pop up somewhere someday.

As you may have guessed, after a few weeks I found the *shukei* lying on a rarely used washing machine on the back office porch which was left there on Saturday night of the O-Bon when it started to rain. I was overjoyed and relieved to find my *shukei*.

This story reminds us of how we often look all over the place for something valuable and how our mind thinks of so many things that are unnecessary such as when I thought someone had stolen it. Because of these thoughts, we are taken further away from where it actually is. Many times, we lose sight of things because our imagination runs wild. Sometimes, we just need to look more carefully and we may find what we are looking for.
